PEC is proud to be guided by the seven cooperative principles:

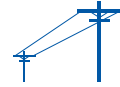

RECOGNITION & ACHIEVEMENTS

We are committed to being a top electric distribution cooperative by delivering exceptional customer service and reliability, maintaining a strong financial position, and investing in our employees for the benefit of our entire membership.

- In 2022, PEC was proudly named a Top Workplace among large employers by the San Antonio Express-News. 
- Top Workplaces also recognized PEC nationally for Cultural Excellence by a Women-Led Business in 2022. This award recognizes the cooperative for its commitment to a people-first culture. 
- Fitch Ratings affirmed PEC's AA- rating in June 2022.
- At the 2022 International Lineman's Rodeo, PEC journeyworkers and lineworker apprentices competed against the best in the world. Crews brought home 10 awards, including four first-place titles.
- In 2023, the PEC Board of Directors approved \$6 million in capital credit distributions to members.
- Staff completed enhanced training scenarios and held more than 260 crew visits at PEC's Safety and Technical Training Center in 2022.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

One of our core cooperative principles – Concern for Community – guides our mission to help make a difference in the communities we serve. It's why we strive to make the place we love to live even better. 

- PEC's Power of Change Program allows members to voluntarily round up their electric bills to the nearest dollar for charity. Those member donations fund community grants for area nonprofits. Since launching, more than 25,000 members have contributed over \$575,000.
- We are proud members of 35 area chambers of commerce.
- We inspire the next generation of members by providing area students with educational and scholarship programs. Since beginning the program 23 years ago, PEC has provided over \$1.4 million in scholarships to high school seniors and adults seeking to further their educations.

TOP 100 CO-OP

In 2022, PEC was named among the top 100 cooperatives in the country as part of National Cooperative Bank's annual Co-op Top 100 list. PEC is ranked no. 72 based on revenue.
