ABOUT US

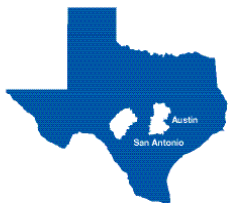
At Pedernales Electric Cooperative (PEC), we are committed to delivering safe, reliable electricity and exceptional customer service to our members and communities.

PEC is proud to be guided by the seven cooperative principles:

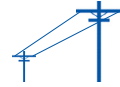

RECOGNITION & ACHIEVEMENTS

We are committed to being a top electric distribution cooperative by delivering exceptional customer service and reliability, maintaining a strong financial position, and investing in our employees for the benefit of our entire membership.

- PEC Fitch Ratings affirmed PEC's AA- rating in June 2024
- PEC reached a major milestone of sustained growth in 2023, installing its 400,000th meter. Over the past decade, PEC has experienced historic growth across its service territory with many of the once-rural areas the co-op serves now ranking among the fastest growing in the U.S.
- In 2023, PEC proudly celebrated 85 years of providing safe, reliable, and low-cost power to its members and communities in the Texas Hill Country.
- At the 2023 International Lineman's Rodeo, PEC journeyworkers and lineworker apprentices competed against the best in the world. For the second consecutive year, PEC won the top overall apprentice spot. Additionally, PEC apprentices brought home 7 awards, including three first-place titles.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

One of our core cooperative principles – Concern for Community – guides our mission to help make a difference in the communities we serve. It's why we strive to make the place we love to live even better.



- PEC's Power of Change Program allows members to voluntarily round up their electric bills to the nearest dollar for charity. Those member donations fund community grants for area nonprofits. Since launching, nearly 32,000 members have contributed more than \$821,000.
- We are proud members of 35 area chambers of commerce.
- We inspire the next generation of PEC members by providing students with educational and scholarship programs. Since beginning the program 25 years ago, PEC has provided more than \$1.5 million in scholarships to high school seniors and adults seeking to further their educations.

TOP 100 CO-OP

In 2023, PEC was named among the top 100 cooperatives in the country as part of National Cooperative Bank's annual Co-op Top 100 list. PEC is ranked no. 88 based on revenue.
